Mask distribution

Our Winter/Spring 2023 cohort of CSC ambassadors will receive a supply of duckbill masks to distribute as part of their campus advocacy. The current cohort will be limited by current mask availability.

We are unfortunately unable to ship supplies to students beyond the United States due to logistical barriers at this time. Applicants who will not be requesting a supply of masks may write N/A in these questions.

Please propose a plan for how you would distribute the masks provided via the CSC ambassador program (the resources CSC currently has available).

For this question we are just looking for an answer to each part of the question: please explain rather than link to your school as websites may change (about 2-4 sentences).

- 3. Why is advocacy for COVID safety and disability inclusion on campus important to you? What are your advocacy priorities?***

For this question we are looking for around a paragraph, or 5-6 sentences. You do not need to justify your advocacy priorities, we are just looking for you to tell us what is most important to you to advocate for - this can be as simple as a list.

4. How will you plan to reflect Disability Justice in your campus advocacy and mask distribution plans? Are you interested in learning how to further incorporate Disability Justice into your work?*

For this question we want to know how you would apply what you know about Disability Justice to the advocacy you plan to do. We don't expect expertise and we are not looking for a "correct" answer so much as a commitment to learning and applying these values.

5. Do you think masks should be required on campus?*

For this question we want to know your stance on mask requirements

6. Optional: How did you hear about our Campus Ambassador program? Did anyone refer you?*

This question helps us understand how people find out about our programs and how to improve our reach.
